
# PSHE at Hove Junior School

In addition to this, lessons are personalised in each year group depending on the needs of the class.





# Curriculum Overview

Our Curriculum Map details all of the opportunities for the teaching and learning of PSHE throughout the year, and includes links to the WWO theme and Learning Characters.


