

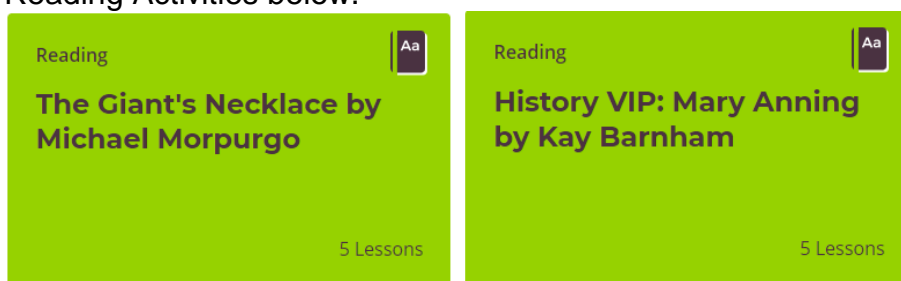
## Year 3

Dear Parent/Carers,

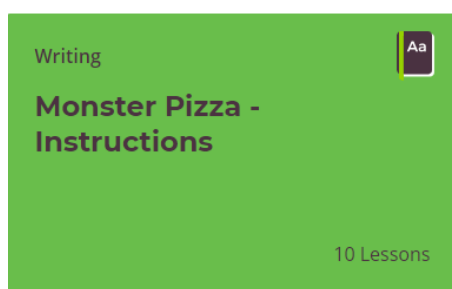
In the event your child has to self-isolate the information below is designed to help you and direct you to video lessons and resources provided by the Oak Academy which will support you in delivering learning at home.

**English Reading:** Read for at least 20 minutes each day. This can be independently, with an adult or sibling.

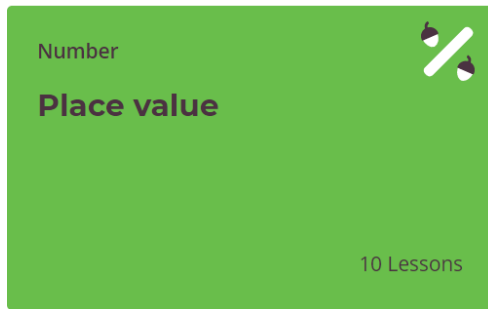

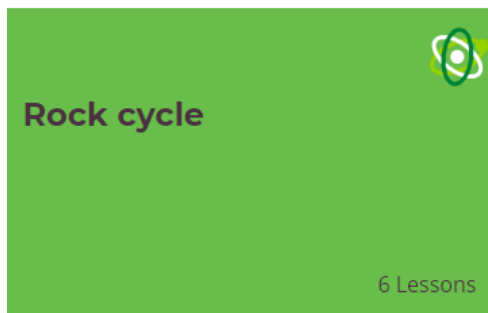

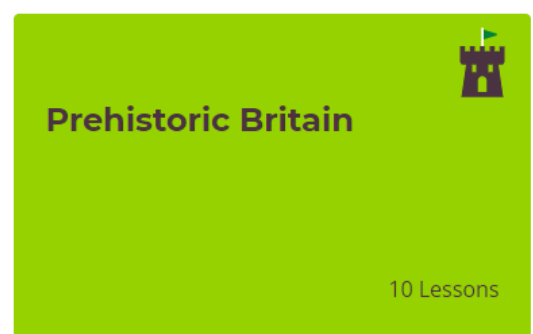
