English Spelling: Access Oak Academy – Visit <https://www.thenational.academy> and enter the Pupil Hub. Click on Subjects and then KS2. Go to English Spelling lessons and click on the spelling lessons below. Complete the lessons online.

Alternatively, press Ctrl + Click on the image below and it will take you straight to the lessons.



Maths: Access Oak Academy – Visit <https://www.thenational.academy> and enter the Pupil Hub. Click on Subjects and then KS2. Go to Maths lessons and click on either Addition and subtraction, or on Multiplication and division. Complete the lessons online. **Alternatively, press Ctrl + Click on either of the images below and it will take you straight to the lessons.**

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Science: Access Oak Academy – Visit <https://www.thenational.academy> and enter the Pupil Hub. Click on Subjects and then KS2. Go to Science lessons and click on either Rock cycle lessons, or Light and dark lessons. Complete the topic lessons online. **Alternatively, press Ctrl + Click on either of the images below and it will take you straight to the lessons.**

Topic – History ‘Portals through the Ages’: Access Oak Academy – Visit <https://www.thenational.academy> and enter the Pupil Hub. Go to find lessons and click on KS2. Go to History lessons, click on Prehistoric Britain and complete the lessons online, starting with lesson 1 and working your way through. **Alternatively, press Ctrl + Click on the image below and it will take you straight to the lessons.**



Challenge: Can you design your own Neolithic settlement? What would people living there need to have nearby in order to survive? What shape would the houses be? You could draw a bird’s eye view, a map or you may like to show your village as a painting or collage.
