

BRIGHTON

English

During our English lessons this term, we will be reading and using the novel 'Dead Man's Cove' by Lauren St John, as inspiration for our writing. We plan to produce effective setting and character descriptions based on the text and we will also be writing diary entries from the perspective of a main character. In addition to the key text, the children will be revisiting the basic skills of writing, creating their own information texts about St Ives in Cornwall and writing their own seaside inspired poetry.

Geography

The children will develop their map and atlas skills and compare the features of a contrasting locality (St Ives, in Cornwall) to Brighton and Hove. They will also learn the key terms of both physical and human geography, using St Ives as a case study.

History

Throughout history lessons this term, we will be carrying out a local history study of Brighton and the local area, and finding out how it has grown and developed from 'Brighthelmstone' in the 11th century, to today.

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<u>Maths</u>

We will begin maths lessons for the year by looking at place value and developing our understanding of rounding. We will then move to work on the four operations, ensuring that we are using formal written methods. Throughout the year, we will be learning long multiplication and long division and extending our knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages.

This term, we will be focusing on developing our hockey and gymnastics skills.

Computing

Our computing foci for the term will be the use of blogs, creating games and the importance of e-safety.

Music

During music lessons, we will be using 'Charanga' to develop our singing performance skills. We will look at pulse, tone and pitch focussing on one of the classic rock heroes: Bon Jovi.

<u>Art</u>

During our art lessons, we will be using water colours to replicate seascapes with our own water colour palettes. We shall also be creating perspective drawings and collages using a range of media.

Science

Our science learning in the autumn term will focus on forces and space.

<u>French</u>

In French, children will be learning how to describe and give information about the place that they live in.

<u>R.E.</u>

Our R.E. focus for the term will be exploring the question, 'What is life like for Hindus in modern Britain?'


Take Home Tasks
